Understand the value of what you've got

What makes you valuable- **Ec 3:19-21** For that which befalleth the sons of men befalleth beasts; even one thing befalleth them: as the one dieth, so dieth the other; yea, they have all one breath; so that a man hath no preeminence above a beast: for all is vanity. 20 All go unto one place; all are of the dust, and all turn to dust again. 21 **Who knoweth** the spirit of man that goeth upward, and the spirit of the beast that goeth downward to the earth?

Ge 2:7 And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living **soul**.

How much the soul is worth- Ps 49:6-8 They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches; 7 None of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him: 8 (For the redemption of their soul is precious, and it ceaseth for ever:)

Take care of what you've got

The soul can be harmed- 1Pe 2:11 Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;

2Pe 2:8 (For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, <u>vexed his righteous soul from day to day</u> <u>with their unlawful deeds</u>;)

1Pe 5:8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, **seeking whom he may devour**:

Pr 6:32 But whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh understanding: he that doeth it destroyeth his own soul.

The soul can be starved- **3Jo 1:1-2** The elder unto the wellbeloved Gaius, whom I love in the truth. 2 Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth.

Col 3:16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

1Th 2:13 For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe. -this would be Gaius! Word dwelling in him, working in him. He is filled w/ it and he is living by it!

Heb 5:12-14 For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are <u>become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat</u>. 13 For every one that useth milk is unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. 14 But <u>strong meat belongeth to them that are</u> of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.

The soul can drift- **Heb 6:19** Which **hope we have as an anchor of the soul**, both sure and stedfast, and which entereth into that within the veil;

Col 1:5 For the hope which is laid up for you in heaven, whereof ye heard before in the word of the truth of the gospel;

Don't make a bad deal with what you've got

1Pe 1:22-23 Seeing ye have <u>purified your souls in obeying the truth</u> through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently: 23 <u>Being born again</u>, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, **by the word of God**, which liveth and abideth for ever.
